



'Zooming' in . . . A Historic Change in the CHS Curriculum

As a Catholic high school, we help foster the faith of community members while providing an invaluable service to our families. Our purpose is to provide continued academic and spiritual growth to students through eLearning and experiences. Although the Catholic High campus is temporarily closed, "school" continues as we engage students with experiences that advance the planned learning program and help them to stay connected with teachers and classmates. These learning experiences offer authentic opportunities to focus on key concepts, knowledge, and skills in order to successfully earn final grades and complete grade level. They emphasize interaction and creativity, involving a balance of on-screen and off-screen tasks that help connect to previous learning and the current curriculum.

Beginning Monday, March 30, Catholic High implemented CHS Online Learning utilizing the videoconferencing software Zoom. We are blessed to have the resources to provide this mode of teaching and have been preparing for it throughout the past several weeks. Our teachers are very determined to make this a wonderful and very positive experience for our students as we work to maintain our excellent education and enable our students to very successfully complete the 2019-20 school year--certainly a historic one!

Completing this year successfully will take the combined efforts of all--the CHS administration and teachers, the parents, and the students. Working together, our Diocesan Superintendent Mr. Michael Juhas and all of our system's school principals developed a document known as Continuity of Learning and Community Plan for Parents and Students which describes in detail the responsibilities and commitment needed by each segment of our school system in order for this learning experience to be successful.

"School hours" for students will continue to be 7:45 a.m.-3:00 p.m., Monday-Friday. Students are 'attending' the same number of classes daily as they did on our regular school schedule prior to March 13 when we closed. Teachers' "office hours" will also be from 7:45-3:00 p.m., Monday-Friday. Every effort is being made to have the school schedule be consistent as Catholic High transitions to a "new normal" with online learning and social distancing.

Catholic High asks that we continue to be kept in the prayers of the Catholic High Family daily, asking the Lord to bless us all with strength, courage, peace, and good health!


