



Dear Pensacola Catholic High School family,

The 76-year history of Pensacola Catholic High School tells the story of faith, love, dedication, growth, support, and family. In sending forth more than 8,600 alumni, Catholic High continues to be known for its legacy of being a beacon of light and faith in the Pensacola community and a source of quality, Catholic secondary education for young men and women.

The CHS Class of 2018 was an enthusiastic and talented group of young people who followed the wonderful example set by previous classes. Special pride was generated by the 105 graduates who generated in excess of \$10 million in scholarships and grants with more than 67% of the class' members receiving either a scholarship and/or grant. 30% of the class earned \$897,600 in Bright Futures Academic Scholarships and an additional 18% of the class earned \$396,000 in Bright Futures

Medallion Scholarships. 98% of the class' members are now pursuing postsecondary education at prestigious colleges and universities throughout our country.

Evidence of the support and confidence held for Catholic High by our alums, families, and friends is seen in the outcome of our Annual Campaign. This year's effort was the most successful in the 29-year history of our campaigns, with the remarkable generosity of the Catholic High Family donating \$523,268.70 to the 2017-2018 campaign.

The Catholic High social media presence has helped to share our 'good news" by its steady increase and growth over this past school year. Starting with a lively 'Giving Tuesday' Campaign last November, we increased our Facebook following by over 1,000+ members. In addition we added an Instagram page and increased our Twitter presence as well. CHS uses its social media apps to disburse important school information, to share news about calendared events with alumni, students, families and friends, and to share everyday pictures of 'student life at CHS.



PRESENTED THE CHRIS GALLMAN SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

Chris Gallman was a member of the CHS Class of 1999. In May of 1998, just days after winning the District high jump gold medal at the end of his Junior year and shortly before he was to leave for the State Track Meet, he died very suddenly and tragically of an undiagnosed heart condition. His death left the Catholic High community stunned and heartbroken. Chris was a very special person...a very talented athlete, a friend to all, rarely seen without a smile on his face and a kind word for everyone.

Shortly after his tragic and untimely death, there was a ground swell of desire from all facets of the CHS family-students, teachers, administrators, parents--recognizing the unique goodness of Chris Gallman, asking that we establish an award in his honor....to memorialize the goodness he contributed and stood for in his life at Catholic High.

Participation in athletics was a very important experience and value for Chris as it is for so many of our students each year. Yet, it was not Chris' abundant athletic talent that was selected as the basis for this award, but rather the manner in which Chris participated on the athletic field that was identified as the focus and criteria for bestowal of this annual award.

Chris was a very talented and successful athlete—he excelled both on the basketball court and on the track. Yet what stood out most in the memory of his coaches, teammates, and peers was not the accolades he won through his natural ability, but rather the spirit of sportsmanship, selflessness, and compassion that he displayed both in practice and in competition.

He was a coach and a friend to fellow competitors, both those who wore the same uniform and those who didn't, always being the first to extend a hand of friendship and compassion. He was an ambassador of goodness and of the joy of life. He gave his utmost to display the finest qualities of sportsmanship.

This year, for the first time since its inception, this award was shared by two recipients, both who have consistently exemplified the qualities for which this award is given. These two young men have clearly demonstrated that their primary concern was their team's unity and integrity, and not their own accomplishments, the same selfless attributes of sportsmanship displayed by Chris Gallman.

It was the fall of 1983--actually the day before classes started that year--that then CHS physical education teacher Ginger Holland approached recent college graduate Richard LaBounty about becoming the head baseball coach at Catholic High. Coach LaBounty's response was that he would try it for one year . . . and here he is 35 years later! Five years after his initial hire date and after a sizable teacher turnover in what Coach LaBounty refers to as him being the 'last man standing,' he was named CHS Athletic Director by default!

It is difficult for Coach LaBounty to narrow down highlights of his career but memories surrounding the CHS athletic program becoming recognized as a state power definitely come to mind. Being named the best athletic program in Florida for consecutive years in 1996 and 1997 definitely are noteworthy. Coaching the Crusader Baseball Team to their first state championship in 2003 and being named National Champions in 2013 certainly are baseball highlights. Yet another acolade will be bestowed on Coach LaBounty in January 2019 as he will be inducted into the Florida Athletic Coaches Association Hall of Fame in Daytona Beach, becoming the first coach from Pensacola to be inducted in 45 years.

Retiring from the Head Baseball Coach position three years ago, Coach LaBounty continues in his position as Athletic Director. He professes to still enjoy coming to CHS every day and considers himself fortunate to have been a Crusader for such a long time. Sharing that while the people at Catholic High may have changed, Catholic High

has not with traditions continuing, the family atmosphere remaining constant, and the competitive spirit staying alive. Coach LaBounty has considered all of his players to be extended family and says he has learned so much from them making him a better man . . . and hopes that he has helped his players to grow which is certainly the case.
