



### STATE AND NATIONAL MATH AWARDS

Catholic Math League (CML) is a national organization that sponsors a math competition that was begun in 1997. The goal of the competition is to develop test taking skills in participating students in preparation for their annual achievement tests and college entrance exams (SAT and ACT). For the 2019-20 school year, CHS took the 1st Place Award for Schools in Florida for the Geometry category and two of our students took both state and national awards.

Geometry: Lexie Foland and Tyler Ruble, currently Sophomores but Freshmen at the time of the test, tied for 1st Place in Florida (1/190 students). They also took National honors as well, tieing for 10th place (10/805)

Algebra I: Lexie Foland placed 2nd in Florida (2/198) and 3rd Nationally (3/1369).








### ATTENDING CLASS

# By Land and By Sea

We want to start sharing with you on a regular basis -- interesting stories about a CHS alumnus/ae who has a unique job or hobby/adventure experience. We know first-hand about our first featured alumnus because his mother, Melody Lipscomb, our current Front Office Receptionist, shared his adventures with us; it sparked our interest and thought it would be interesting and exciting to start a new series in our periodic publications. Tucker Lipscomb, a 2014 Catholic High graduate, has a unique job that takes him out to "sea" on a regular basis and an interesting hobby that has him traversing the "land". After graduation Tucker headed to Galveston Texas where he attended Texas A&M University-Texas Maritime Academy. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Marine Transportation with a minor in Maritime Administration. He graduated in December of 2017 as a licensed Unlimited Tonnage Third Mate Upon Oceans and Near Coastal – which means he could handle big ships both on the open "sea" and near the coasts.

Immediately after graduation, Tucker worked in the petroleum industry for about a year, running an Offshore Supply Vessel that provided fuel, groceries, water, spare parts, etc. to offshore oil rigs in the Gulf of Mexico. He also ran one voyage to Trinidad & Tobago. He currently works on a survey ship based on the US east coast where he is the "Relief Captain", responsible for the safe navigation of the vessel during his 12hour watch. In maritime verbiage a watch is the same as a shift. He is also the Safety Officer, making sure that all safety inspections, drills/ training, and maintenance are conducted onboard. His primary goal is to ensure that the 30 people aboard the vessel arrive safely back to port at the end of the hitch (a.k.a. rotation at sea) alive and with all their limbs. He currently works six weeks on and six weeks off.

During his first year after college, Tucker spent more than 9 months offshore working while at the same time paying for a nice apartment in Charleston, South Carolina. When he was onshore, again usually for several weeks at a time, he spent a lot of time traveling and began to view his apartment as a wasted expense which led him to start thinking of alternative solutions. After a little over a year in Charleston, he moved his home base back to Pensacola and lived with a buddy.



In June/July of 2019 he began solo hiking the Appalachian Trail (AT), during his periods of time off work. He completed just under 500 miles of the AT, with aspirations of finishing the remaining 1,500 miles in 2020, but COVID-19 came along and altered his plans. During all of his off-time adventures he kept wondering how he could afford to travel around the US/North America full time when he was not at work. He knew staying in hotels for six weeks at a time while moving around would not be reasonable. Initially he considered building out a retired school bus, but after considering the parking, fuel costs, and wanting to go "off-road" at times, he ruled this option out. After additional days of extensive research, he finally decided to buy a van and build it out





so he could live out of it full time. He found what he was looking for to start the project but before he made the big purchase, he decided that he probably should bring his parents in on "the plan" before he just showed up with a massive white van. He knew from experience that he needed to have a good plan and be ready with all the answers to the questions they would be sure to have. He sat down with them, shared his proposal and their initial reaction was one of "have you totally lost your mind"! After a few hours of discussion during which Tucker showed them his designs, various layouts and the features he planned to implement, they began to warm to the idea and thought him only "half crazy". Tucker shared that his parents have always been supportive of his decisions even if they have not always seen/had the same dreams.

The following day, on January 4, 2020, Tucker drove to Mobile, Alabama to purchase the van he had researched and spent the next 7+ months building out the van he now affectionately calls Vern. It was during his spare time while offshore, that he spent countless hours reading, drawing, designing, and learning from others who have already completed such projects. Building a van can be guite a challenge and learning how to maximize every inch and understand the engineering capabilities and limitations of design was very important. He cites that nothing is flat and/or square and everything has to be able to withstand the vibration of a constantly moving vehicle. Tucker had 276 online orders, mostly from Amazon and eBay that he had shipped to his parents' house in Pensacola – thankfully they still had his bedroom to store all the "loot".

At one point, Tucker's address in Pensacola was so popular with Amazon that they accidentally shipped him a wheelchair! After talking with Amazon, they told him to keep it because they did not want the expense of shipping it back. Using one of the Core Values he learned at CHS and lived in his family, Selfless Love, Tucker opted to donate the chair to a local charity instead of profiting from his good fortune.

The actual "hands-on" conversion of the van took about 10 weeks collectively while Tucker was home between hitches and Vern was finally ready for her first full blown adventure on August 27. Tucker departed Pensacola and drove to Baton Rouge to pick-up Casey Lowery, fellow Crusader from the Class of 2013. Over the next five

days they drove 2,304 miles through eight states. They spent about ten days between the Grand Tetons and Yellowstone National Park. After picking up another classmate from 2013, they continued their travels throughout Colorado and eastern Utah. Tucker has lived out of the van full time and has driven over 6,200 miles. In October he left Vern in a safe storage facility in Colorado and returned to his job offshore. In mid-November they reunited and are currently traveling around Utah, Arizona, Nevada, California, Oregon and Washington. Plans with Vern for 2021, which are all contingent upon COVID-19, include driving the Pan American Highway, a journey from Prudhoe Bay, Alaska to the resort town of Ushuaia at the southernmost tip of Argentina in South America. If this works out, Tucker plans to travel from Ushuaia to Antarctica before returning back to America. Vern the van will be transported back via ship during this time.

Tucker, please keep us apprised of your travels and adventures with Vern the van, and know that your Catholic High Family has you, and all Crusaders - past, present and future - in our prayers!





# Building On Faith,

CARES ACT: Charitable Giving Incentives

Congress recently passed the CARES Act, an economic stimulus program that includes incentives for individual and corporate donors who are interested in supporting 501(c)(3) charitable organizations.

- The CARES Act allows you to take a charitable deduction of up to \$300 for those who take the standard deduction.
- If you itemize your deductions, the new law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as Pensacola Catholic High School to be deducted up to 100% of your adjusted gross income for the 2020 calendar year.
- For corporations, the limit on charitable deductions for cash contributions in 2020 is increased from 10% to 25%.
- Considering a charitable distribution from your IRA? The CARES Act suspends required minimum distributions (RMD) in 2020, but you still have the option to direct up to \$100,000 per year from your IRA to a charity.
- As always, we encourage you to consult with your financial advisor regarding charitable giving.
