
On March 27 and 29, the Catholic High School family lost two beloved teachers, current Music teacher, Sara Gordon, and retired teacher/coach, Robert Burke, respectively.

SARA EMILEY GORDON (June 28, 1988 - March 27, 2021)

Sara came to Pensacola Catholic High School in the fall of 2017 and wore multiple "hats" including music teacher, band director, choral instructor, drama club moderator, and even JV soccer coach for a year. She was instrumental in growing the music/band program while she was here, and also introduced a new classical quitar class and a drama class. Prior to coming to CHS, Sara taught at our sister diocesan high school in Tallahassee, St. John Paul II Catholic High School.



On Tuesday, March 29, Catholic High School held a memorial service to remember Sara and to pray for her and her family. She was loved



when I would leave campus late in the afternoon, sometimes between 5-6 pm, Sara would still be here working with her band students or

her drama club. Her commitment to excellence was just a part of her, and she never once complained about the extra time these activities took. Teaching was definitely her vocation!" ROBERT MICHAEL "COACH" BURKE

(November 12, 1922 - March 29, 2021)



Coach Burke was in the last graduating class of St. Michael's in 1941, which in the fall of '41 became our current Pensacola Catholic High School. With Coach's passing, we have not only lost a friend and beloved Coach, but we have also lost a part of Catholic High History. Through the years Coach Burke has been many things to Catholic High School - basketball coach, science teacher, moderator of clubs, and some have even affectionately called him

The Godfather of Catholic High. He taught and coached at CHS for over 75 years. He is most remembered for his positivity and humor in dealing with his students. He not only coached sports and taught science, but he taught student "life lessons" that would help them beyond their "book learning". On the occasion of his 90th birthday in 2012 the Pensacola News Journal did an article celebrating his life and commitment to Catholic High School. Taylor Deininger '14, a junior botany student at the time, was guoted in that article saying, "He teaches you skills to present yourself whenever you're interviewing for a job." Coach Burke was a living example of Catholic High's Core Values - Selfless Love, Commitment to Excellence, Personal Integrity, and Commitment to Service. John Campbell '79 who played basketball on Coach Burke's team was also quoted as saying, "One of the things he told me



was 'Always do your best and leave the rest to God." While Coach Burke will no longer walk the halls of Catholic High School, we know that his spirit will live on here for many more years through the hearts and memories of the many lives he impacted. Rest in peace, Coach Burke!

While we miss Mrs. Gordon and Coach Burke, we are comforted in knowing the promise of Jesus in Matt. 8:11 - "Many will come from east and west, and sit down with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven". It is our faith that tells us that Sara and Coach Burke are already sitting at that table and reveling with the Lord. We, too, must have faith that we will be reunited with them, and all of our loved ones who have gone before us, one day. Our continued prayers go out to both families!

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the Mercy of God, rest in peace! Amen.

NATIONAL MATH AWARDS FOR PENSACOLA CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL

Catholic Math League (CML) is a national organization that sponsors a math competition that was begun in 1997. The goal of the competition is to develop test taking skills in participating students in preparation for their annual achievement tests and college entrance exams (SAT and ACT). The CML annual contest is offered for students from 3rd grade through Advanced Math. The annual competition consists of students taking 4 CML math tests, spread throughout the school year. The test results are submitted to the CML for scoring. State and National Annual awards are then given to students who took the tests based on their achievement in different categories within their state and across the nation.

For the 2020-2021 school year, CHS took the 1st Place Award for Schools across the Nation for the Algebra II category and three of our students placed within the top 6 nationally in the same category out of the 408 students that competed. Tyler Ruble placed #1, Elizabeth Owens placed #5, and Lexie Foland placed #6. Congratulations to Tyler, Elizabeth, Lexie, Mr. Forte, and the entire CHS Math Department for their achievements and the great representation of Catholic High!



CRUBOTICS

The Crubotics (a.k.a. Crusader Robotics) Team has had quite the year. As previously shared, they were upgraded from the small "closet" they had before to a wonderful classroom space that was created for them in the kitchen area of the old cafeteria, and through the generosity of donors and grant awards they were





ANNUAL MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY

Over 400 students and parent volunteers from Catholic High School gathered on March 6 for the school's 26th annual Make a Difference Day. The event began at 7:15 a.m. at the new Nickelsen Family Courtyard on the CHS campus. Students checked in with their project leaders and then Bishop William Wack lead a prayer service in thanksgiving for all the wonderful volunteers, for their safety and for the beautiful weather God had sent! Sr. Kierstin Martin, CHS Principal, recognized the presence of Jane Moseley who began the original MADD at CHS in 1996 and who, since retiring in May of 2020, came back to participate and lead one of the projects for the first time. Then, Sr. Kierstin officially released the students into the community to partake in 25 different service projects to "Make a Difference.

Students helped with clean-up and landscaping work in cemeteries, at school play yards, and at local churches. Teams served at the Alpha Center, Sacred Heart Miracle Camp, Martha's Vineyard, ARC Gateway, Waterfront Mission, Alfred-Washburn Center, and many other locations to 'Make a Difference'. Two teams even braved the cool waters to assist with ecology work at Dead Man's Island in Gulf Breeze and to help build a reef along the bay shores in Milton. Another team used the school's kitchen to cook three different meals for the Ronald McDonald House quests and delivered them in time for their quests to enjoy a delicious pasta bar lunch with salad. Students and parent volunteers worked on their projects until Noon before returning to the Tolan Family Student Life Center for a lunch that was also prepared by a team.

Make a Difference Day, also called MADD around campus, began at Catholic High in 1996 when CHS joined a national movement, originally sponsored by Gannett Publishing, that was held on the third Saturday of October every year. The national movement discontinued a few years ago, but Catholic High has continued the tradition in support of our Core Values - Selfless Love, Commitment to Excellence, Personal Integrity, and Commitment to Service. In October 2019, the school celebrated the 25th anniversary of participation. Because of issues tied to the pandemic, the CHS administration decided to move the 2020 event to the spring of 2021 with the hopes that students would be able to participate.











SPRING FOOD DRIVE



It is an absolute honor and blessing to be inducted into the Catholic High Hall of Fame alongside such amazing friends and classmates.



BEHIND THE CAMERA

If you were one of the recipients/purchasers of the special edition 2021 calendar that was put together by Mrs. Judy Kaczor and some of her past Charisma editors, then you have seen the beautiful nature photography of 1977 CHS graduate, Elton Pride. I myself was in awe and wanted to know more about the man behind the camera. Elton was kind enough to answer my questions so I could share them with the CHS family. Thank you, Elton, for your time and for sharing your talent with us!

When and what led you to take up photography?



Mr. Peacock, a teacher during my 8th-grade year at Saint Joseph's, brought his Nikon F camera to school to take class pictures. I asked if I could take a look at the camera and I was hooked. During the summer break; I worked at the NAS yacht club and other various odd jobs so I could pay on the camera I had put on layaway at the camera shop in Town & Country Plaza, a Mamiya/Sekor 1000 DTL, which I still have. When I started at CHS that fall it was rare for me not to have my camera hanging around my neck, as I took it everywhere I went. One day, Mr. Kings, who did facilities maintenance at the school, saw me with my camera; he asked, do you know how to use that camera? I replied, I am learning by trial and error. Mr. Kings responded; if you want to learn how to use the camera, stop by my shop after your classes. I went by to see him that afternoon. I walked in the shop and behind a curtain he revealed three walls all shelved with photography books. He gave me three and said,

"Read these, and when you are done I'll give you three more to read. Read the books, take pictures and I'll critique your work and teach you how to create photographs." From that point forward, he became my mentor. Not many people know it, but Mr. Kings was a retired Navy photographer and served as President Eisenhower's official photographer during a portion of his military career. Mr. Kings taught me a great deal from the many critiques. I would not be the photographer I am today without the encouragement and training I received from him.

Did you take up photography professionally when you graduated from CHS?

No, I received an athletic scholarship to run track at Louisiana State University; however, I continued to pursue photography. My intention was to get a degree in psychology. However, I decided early on to switch from psychology and pursue a degree in Graphic Design. From LSU I went on to

Rochester Institute of Technology, where I received an Academic scholarship and completed my Master's Degree in Computer Graphics. I have spent the last 30 years working in the automotive industry, as well as having my own companies, as a consultant, trainer, and speaker. It is my upbringing and the Catholic High Core Values that have helped me be successful in life and I weave those values into my message that I convey when I am training/speaking. Nonetheless, Catholic High played a major role in laying my academic and athletic foundation. A CHS Core Value foundation that I continue to build on. In addition, interaction with teachers and coaches gave me the belief I had the ability to choose.



I can tell by the pictures in the calendar that you are well-traveled. If photography was not your job, how did you amass such a vast and varied collection?

Persistence, determination and travel; I've been to every state in the U.S. except Alaska and Maine. When traveling on business or for pleasure, I'll plan a photo excursion. It is not uncommon for me to wake up at 1 a.m., Drive two hours and hike 3 to 4 miles to ensure I can catch a planned moment or spontaneous opportunities that arise. For me photography is a high flow activity, it allows me to totally engage, enjoy, relax/de-stress and capture a moment in nature, from my backyard or the Rocky Mountains and beyond. Nonetheless, I'm working on a way for others to engage and share in the enjoyment of my images, which will be in place in the next 90 days.

The photography that was included in the calendar and the items you showcase on your website are stunning. What can you tell us about some of your favorites?



My favorites, that's like asking me which of my daughters I like best. I don't have a favorite photograph. It's about the experience of the journey. I enjoy them all for the peace, joy and relaxed state they incite when viewed. However, my daughters win the enjoyment factor every time.

MADISON WALKER '06

THE PHYSICS OF A FRISBEE IN FLIGHT

It was the spring of 2006 and seniors in Mrs. Dana Lupton's physics class were required to complete a project explaining the physics of "anything" the student selected. Madison Walker turned in her project - 'The Physics of a Frisbee in Flight'. Little did she know the foreshadowing it held of her future career as a Professional Disc Golfer.

Madison graduated from Catholic High School in 2006 and then attended the University of Southern Mississippi where she finished her Bachelor's Degree in Marine Biology right after the start of the Deepwater Horizon oil spill in 2010. She felt a calling to return to Pensacola and work on the clean-up effort along the shorelines of the Gulf Coast in the wake of the disaster. She also started waiting tables at some of Pensacola's favorite restaurants, and in her spare time enjoyed playing disc golf.





She entered a few local tournaments to try her hand at competing, entering her first tournament as a professional in May of 2013. At the end of 2014 after meeting and befriending Paige Pierce, the number one female in the sport, Paige invited Madison to join her full-time, following the disc golf tour and playing events all over the country. She started her rookie year in an atypical fashion, skipping regional events and jumping straight to playing all the top national events. As she toured, she worked on perfecting her game, and started winning/placing at tournaments. She built a name for herself through her commitment to excellence, earning sponsorships and opportunities that enabled her to continue touring. In addition to playing tournaments, Madison has also contributed to the sport by providing tournament commentary, side-line reporting, and running clinics/workshops for non-professionals, mostly women and kids. By the end of 2016, after two touring seasons, she earned a Women's Professional Disc Golf Association (PDGA) ranking of #6.

In March 2017 Madison sustained a wrist injury that cut her competition season short, but she continued to provide side-line commentary, reporting, and media, as well as assisting with workshops and tournaments. She competed on the professional tour again in 2018 and worked her way back up to a year-end #9 ranking in the Women's PDGA. 2019 started slowly, but by mid-season, Madison was competing at the highest level of her career, grabbing a PDGA World Title in the Mixed Doubles division with her partner Zach Melton. At the World Championships the following week, she sustained another injury on her finger, forcing her to end her season mid-year. Madison was forced to continue working on the injury into 2020, and after making the tough decision to forfeit her tour, the pandemic forced all disc golf events to be canceled. After a long year off, Madison is excited and ready to return to the sport for the 2021 tour.





To cap off a crazy year, she was also pleasantly surprised to be offered a role as the Environmental and Special Initiatives Coordinator with the Disc Golf Professional Tour. In this newly formed role, Madison will finally get to use her education in the sciences and care for the environment in the sport she loves. She will consult with tournament directors to implement a set of environmental best management practices that will promote partnership with local communities, seek to minimize event impacts, and focus on environmental education of all disc golfers. She is ecstatic to be able to "double-dip" in the sport by providing her educational expertise while also still being able to compete.

Little did she realize in the spring of 2006 when she submitted her physics project to Mrs. Lupton that she would circle back to it indirectly through her career. It just goes to show you how God is always working in our lives. We just need to make sure we remain open to seeing and listening to his guidance. We wish Madison many blessings in her future endeavors! 


DEDICATION OF NEW BUILDINGS


