DEAR CRUSADER FAMILY,

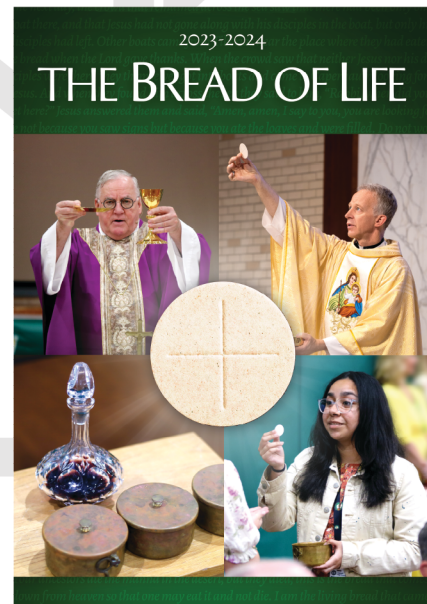

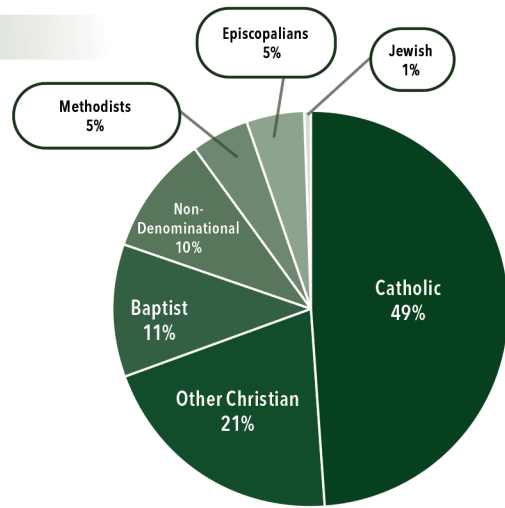

Welcome New Faculty

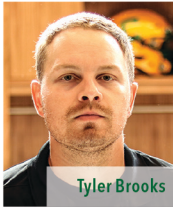
We welcome the following new /returning faculty and staff since the Fall of 2022.

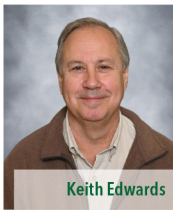
Tyler Brooks

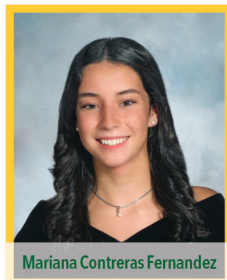

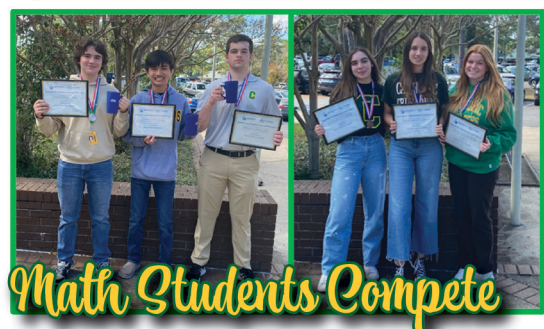

Our Crusader Football team had an exceptional year! Not only did they win the first Bishop's Cup for the Diocese (see Front cover and page 2), but they ended the regular season with a record of 8-2, earning a spot into post-season competition. The Crusaders hosted the Suwannee Bulldogs in the Class 2S Regional Quarterfinals and emerged victorious. The Crusaders advanced to the Regional Semifinals and traveled to Walton for the second time this season, but this time returned home triumphant which earned them a spot in the Regional Final game. On November 24, the Crusaders traveled to Tallahassee to take on the Florida State University High School Seminoles where they emerged as Regional Champions and with an opportunity to play in the Final Four. In a hard-fought game against the Bradford Tornados in Starke, FL, the Crusaders ended their season with an overall record of 11-3. 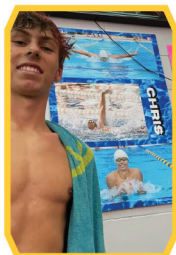

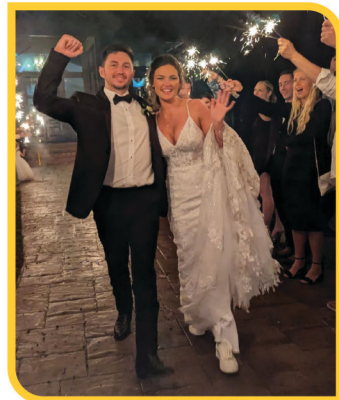

Make a Difference Day

On September 30, CHS held its 29th Annual Make a Difference Day during which 500+ students and parent volunteers descended upon the community to "Make a Difference." The event began at 7:15 a.m. in the Nickelsen Family Courtyard on the CHS campus where students checked in with their project leaders and met up with friends in their assigned projects. Teams served non-profit organizations including ARC Gateway, Martha's Vineyard, Rosewood Manor, Waterfront Mission, Covenant Care, Manna Food Bank, and other locations to 'Make a Difference.' Students and parent volunteers worked on their projects until Noon before returning to the Tolan Family Student Life Center for a lunch that was also prepared by a team of parent volunteers. 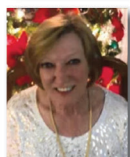

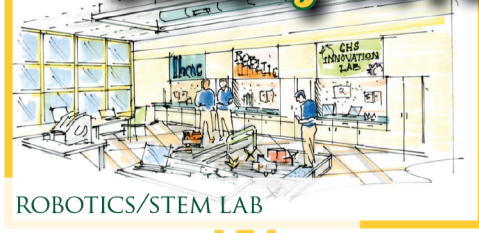

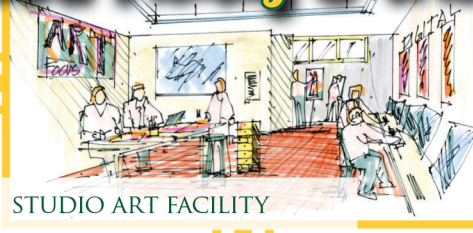

Thank you to all who gave so generously during that first phase of fundraising as you have helped us realize the dream of our completed Tolan Family Student Life Center, Nickelsen Family Courtyard, and the Athletic Complex, all of which our students currently utilize. We have recently updated our Master Growth Plan and are anxious to get started on the remaining projects that were part of the original plan, as well as the new items that we added:

Projects Carried Over from the 2018 plan:

- Construction of three new classrooms that were part of the 2018 plan (construction began in September 2023)
- Replacement of restrooms and windows in the Music Building
- Permanent renovation of the previous Cafeteria building into a new Robotics/STEM Lab and Art Studio.
- Construction of five new administrative offices and a canopy to connect administrative building to the Tolan Family Student Life Center.

New projects added to the Master Growth Plan in 2023:

- Construction of three athletic practice fields with restroom facility, parking lot and access road.
- Baseball/Softball Facility improvements including new restroom facility, new Softball dugouts and new locker-room/storage building.
- Renovation of the Library/Media Center for a more diverse use by students, faculty, and the entire CHS family.
- Continued enhancements to Campus Security as the footprint of the campus expands.
