National Merit Finalist

Congratulations to Senior Emma Thompson who has been designated a National Merit Florida State University Scholar as a Finalist in the National Merit Scholarship Program for the 2024-2025 academic year! Emma was notified in the Fall of 2024 that she was a Semifinalist and worked closely with the Catholic High Guidance Office to submit a detailed scholarship application which included information about her academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstration of leadership abilities, employment, and honors/awards received. The nationwide pool of Semifinalists is determined each year by the scores received on the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) in the Fall of their Junior year. They represent less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, and include the highest-scoring entrants in each state. Emma's scholarship was awarded in the College-Sponsored Merit Scholarship category that falls under the National Merit Scholarship Program. There are approximately 150 colleges/universities currently participating in this category. Congratulations, Emma, on this distinguished award!

Crubotics, a.k.a. the CHS Robotics Team, competed in the 12th Annual Gulf Coast Regional MATE (Marine Advanced Technology Education) competition, hosted by Dauphin Island Sea Lab during the last weekend in April. The Crubotics Regional team is 17 members strong and competed in two different classifications. A combined total of 900 hours was spent by the Ranger and Navigator teams to plan, build, and test two Remotely-Operated Vehicles (underwater robots) to accomplish simulated real-world scenarios. The Ranger Team placed second, and the Navigator Team placed third in their respective divisions. The Navigator Team also earned the Buoyancy Award (best attitude). Thank you to STEM Coordinator, Dana Lupton, Math Teacher, Justin Cutchin, and Mac McKinley Class of '24 for moderating the teams and helping them prepare for and maneuver this year's competition. CHS Competes in 51st Nicholas Walker Math Tournament

On Friday, April 4, the Catholic High Math Teams, moderated by Teachers Maria Green and Alex Forte, competed in the 51st Annual Nicholas S. Walker Math Tournament hosted by Milton High School. More than 200 students from the tri-county area, including 23 from CHS, completed math problems in Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, and Calculus as part of CIPHERING Matches to earn points for their team. The top three teams in each discipline were awarded prizes, along with the overall winner. CHS also took Second Place in the Algebra I event and Third Place Overall. Congratulations! Quiz-Saders Take on the CHS Faculty



On the afternoon of Thursday, May 2, Mr. Bowersox and the CHS Quiz-Saders academic competition team hosted the first-ever CHS Student-Faculty Trivia Challenge. This competition was open to all students and faculty. Eight faculty members and 12 students competed in a team-based trivia contest in which a wide variety of academic and pop culture questions were answered. There were many spectators who added excitement to the competition. By a final score of 325 to 230, the student team emerged victorious and were awarded a plaque. The Quiz-Saders team plans to make this an annual event.

Academic/Athletic Recognition

Aidan Baker has been recognized by the Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) as a member of the 31st Annual Florida Dairy Farmers Academic All-State Team. This program honors 24 graduating student-athletes, 12 girls and 12 boys from all throughout the state, who excel in both athletics and academics. To be eligible for this award, students must be a graduating senior with a minimum 3.5 unweighted grade point average and earned a minimum of two varsity letters in at least two different sports during their junior and senior year. The selection committee then evaluates nominees based on their athletic participation, academic record, extracurricular activities, community service and essays. Aidan, along with the other honorees, will be recognized at a banquet in June at which each will receive a \$1,700 scholarship. Congratulations, Aidan!

Rally Club Hits Fundraising Goal

The student-led Rally Club organization at Pensacola Catholic High School led two more fundraisers this Spring to raise funds and awareness to help fight childhood cancer. With guidance from the Rally Gulf Coast affiliated with the Studer Family Children's Hospital at Ascension Sacred Heart Hospital and their Club Moderator, Keith Haynes, who also serves as the CHS Communications Director, the students sold 760 tickets for a raffle "basket"/Yeti cooler valued at over \$1,700 and filled with all sorts of goodies that were 100% donated by local businesses and friends of Catholic High. Club president Kate Johnson and vice-president, Jack Barter were instrumental in the success of this, and the other fundraisers held by the Club throughout the year. Ticket sales culminated at a January CHS Boys Basketball "Goldstrong Game" against Milton High School. Helene Donovan was the lucky winner of the Yeti cooler, but all ticket purchasers were winners as they helped the Rally Club raise \$3,126 on this one fundraiser. In March, they hosted a final "GoldStrong Game" in coordination with the boys and girls' lacrosse teams. With the \$1,000 raised during the Fall "Goldstrong Game" added to their total, the Rally Club managed to meet their year-end goal of \$5,000 raised in the fight against childhood cancer.

Both the **Boys Basketball** and **Girls Basketball** programs had winning seasons with overall winning records of 14-9 and 13-11 respectively. The Boys finished as District 3A Runner-Up and the Girls lost in the Semifinal game. The basketball teams are led by Coaches Mike Dimick - Boys and Matt Hayes - Girls.

The **Boys Soccer** Team led by Coach Jack Martin ended their season as District 3A Runner-Up with an overall record of 8-9-2. They lost in a tough quarterfinal game in the Regional Tournament.



The **Girls Soccer** Team, led by first-year Coach John Guidroz, had a remarkable season with an overall record of 19-2-1. They finished as District 3A Runner-Up and advanced to the Final game in Regional play in which they lost by one goal to South Walton, the same team that beat them in the District Final game.

Coach Holly Brown returned to lead the Lady Crusader **Softball Team** which had a good season but were eliminated in the quarterfinal round of the District tournament.

The **Baseball** Team finished their season with a record of 11-13, missing the play-offs for the first time in 28 years, second in the State for the longest streak for play-off appearances. Coach Richard LaBounty, after leading the program for 36-years, is officially retiring, and Coach Cory Middleton, who has been with the program as an Assistant Coach since 2019, will take over as Head-Coach in 2025-2026.

Led by Coach Dan Hopson, the **Boys Lacrosse** Team had a winning season with an overall record of 16-4. They finished as District 1A Runner-Ups and competed in the Regional Tournament in which they lost in the Semifinal game.



The **Girls Lacrosse** Team was led by first-year Coach Leigh Frosch and had a great season bringing home the District 1A Championship and an overall record of 19-4. They also advanced to the Regional 1A Final game, the farthest in school Girls Lacrosse tournament play.

In his 20th year as the CHS Tennis Coach, Geoff Watts led the **Boys and Girls Tennis** Teams through another great season! The Boys won the District 1A Championship and the Girls were Runner-Up. Both teams advanced to Regional competition in which the Boys advanced to the Final match, losing 4-3 to Maclay. The Girls lost in the Semifinals 4-0 to Maclay. The Boys #1 Doubles Team, Gannon Davis and Andrew Swan, qualified for the individual draw in the FHSAA State Tournament at which they lost in the quarterfinal round, 6-2, 6-1.



The Crusader **Weightlifting** Team, led by Coach Ji Theriot, once again qualified four athletes to this year's State Tournament - Noah Hamlin, Bryant Kyte, Terius Mason, and Colton Weeks. Congratulations to Bryant who placed 6th in the Olympic classification and 10th in the Traditional classification for his weight class!

Under the guidance of Head Coach Troy Fauchaux, the CHS **Track and Field** teams had a phenomenal year. They competed in several local meets and came away with both team and individual medals. In the District 2A meet, the Boys won the District Championship, and the Girls placed third. A total of 43 individual medals were brought home, with 19 of those as individual District Champions. Additionally, twenty other individual ribbons for placing 4th through 8th were earned, and 24 athletes qualified in 48 events to compete at Regionals. The Regional meet was held at Pine Forest High School, at which the athletes achieved several personal bests, helping the Boys to place 10th out of 30 teams and the Girls to place 12th out of 26 teams. Nine students qualified to compete in the State meet which was held in Jacksonville on May 9 including Zamari Purifoy - 100M & 200M, Aidan Baker - 1600M, Zaden Purifoy - 110 Hurdles, Matthew Ramirez - Javelin, Natalie Jackson - 400M & 4X400M Relay, Railynn Cover - 4X400M Relay, Callie Howard - 4X400M Relay, Cate Carlson - 4X400M Relay, and Addison Manning - Long Jump. The Team placed 12th out of approximately 120 teams, and three of our athletes medaled in the State Meet - Matthew Ramirez, second-Javelin; Zamari Purifoy, fourth 200M; and Zaden Purifoy, fifth 110M Hurdles. Congratulations Crusaders!





In the Fall of 1997, the CHS Alumni Committee launched an initiative to honor CHS Alumni who have continued to embody the CHS Core Values of Selfless Love, Commitment to Excellence, Personal Integrity, and Commitment to Service long after leaving the halls of CHS. During the Annual CHS Eucharistic Celebration & Fish Fry, this year's inductee was announced – Robin Bellan from the Class of 1958.

While at Catholic High, Robin was an excellent student, active in several clubs and in service opportunities. She was a Carnival Queen candidate her Junior year, Homecoming Queen her Senior year, and was also voted 'Best Looking' by her fellow students during her Senior year. After graduation, she attended Florida State University for one year and then returned to Pensacola to marry her high school sweetheart. Robin began her career at C & P Bank and later worked for the City of Pensacola Parks and Recreation Department for 40 years, a job she loved! Through this job she was involved in many of the city's activities throughout the years. 


Here's what we heard recently






